



- Course contained too much information to digest for individuals who are not incredibly interested in the subject matter (but are at least interested to some degree). As a result, it was difficult to stay fully attentive throughout lectures at all times. Could incorporate more breaks or other informative tangents to provide time to digest information. The tangents/stories incorporated were entertaining and interesting.

- He is a very funny and charismatic person, he makes lectures enjoyable. He is good at explaining concepts in different ways for students to understand. I can tell that he enjoys working with students. One downside is he moves quickly through the material, which personally makes it hard to keep up (but understandable given the course material).
- He is badass!! Very enjoyable to listen to and is interest in the material is contagious. I thoroughly

enjoyed his lectures.

- He is so incredibly knowledgeable and gives super insightful and interesting lectures. I appreciate how he always provides students with extra resources to dive deeper into the topics he introduces.
- He is very earnest and knowledgeable and I feel engaged when he is speaking. He also seems very kind and I would feel comfortable asking him any questions. The only negative I have about him is that often his microphone will go out or disconnect him completely, and once he could not even hear other students asking questions during the lecture. I understand that this is not his fault but it draws my attention away from the lecture and I often miss some information that I have to go back to rewatch.
- He is very knowledgable in his field, and it really shows during his lectures. I appreciate the way he focuses on big picture ideas as opposed to small details. I also think that his lectures engage students as he finds ways to connect material to observations he has made in his own life. I think he brings in outside situations and videos that especially solidify concepts and my understanding of course material.
- He likes to focus on very straightforward and main ideas rather than get boggled down by minute details. This is appreciated. The accent makes the lectures more enjoyable as well. I also feel that the lectures can be disorganized sometimes.
- He was my favorite of the two main instructors, not to hate on Petigura in the slightest. I always seemed to have questions for him, and he always seemed to have great answers! I will say that one thing to improve could be the way you space your powerpoint slides to keep pace, I thought that could be a bit better.
- His lectures were very engaging and he explained things very well. However, students have to listen well in the lectures because his slides presentation do not always have a lot of notes, and he mostly gives us pertinent information during the lecture.

- I absolutely loved (virtually) attending Professor Jewitt's lectures. I appreciated the pacing of his lectures, both in terms of lecturing speed and amount of material covered. I never felt overwhelmed by the sheer amount of material or speed at which is was being explained (in the way I sometimes did during Professor Petigura or Friscia's lectures). It was also great how P. Jewitt's personality shined through in his lectures; it was just as interesting hearing his analysis of the portraits of certain scientists ("He looks like someone who'd compel you to flee the country and never look back") or genius analogies ("the earth's mantle is like really cool tomato ketchup") as it was the rest of his course material. I also so appreciated how he only gave us supplementary materials that would enrich our understanding, not further confuse us. I thoroughly enjoyed watching the assigned videos and documentaries, especially "The Good, the Bad, and the Ugly," which heavily featured P. Jewitt! That was awesome. P. Jewitt also offered very thorough answers to any student questions during office hours or via email. I will never forget the pleasant surprise of receiving an email response, once, in under ten minutes! Thank you for helping make this a great quarter, (King) Jewitt.
- I deeply appreciated Professor Jewitt's focus on inspiring us to become more scientifically literate by changing how we viewed science! I am also very grateful that despite his expertise and fame within astronomy, he chose to teach this GE Cluster for primarily non-STEM majors, I could easily tell how passionate and knowledgeable he is from all of his lectures and quick responses to my emails. The only suggestion I have is to rephrase the Free Response question on Quiz 3 about "key features of the structure of the solar system" and instead emphasize "key features of the solar system on a large scale". Overall, thank you Professor Jewitt!

However Jewitt slowed any student to interrupt him with questions if any material was unclear and also used many movies and pictures throughout the lecture to make sure students who are visual learners are able to understand the lectures better.
- Jewitt was an amazing instructor and I will forever be grateful for being taught by him. His lectures were extremely interesting, I can truly say I learned the most from him. Not only that, but he was the only introductor that brought in different perspectives about the subject that tied in really well with the material. I appreciated that aspect a lot, you can tell it was important for him to do so, as well.

During lectures, he sometimes says that something won't be needed, but then it shows up on a quiz.  Quiz 3, however, I felt wasn't clear in the slides. When I rewatched the lecture, it seemed like you were talking about objects like asteroids and comets since those were so heavily emphasized. This confused me and as a result I got my lowest quiz score so far. maybe include (these are NOT objects) or something like that to really distinguish the difference more.
- One of the quizzes had a very vague question which could have several interpretations and the marking scheme was very strict and unfair, causing many students to get marks as low as 3/10 and 2.5/10 in the quiz, which affected our morale and drive, as well as our faith in the quiz markschemes.

He presented the course's ideas seamlessly but always reminded us that there was a process of scientific discovery behind every finding.

He also included a lot of engaging videos and articles that added to the overall learning experience. Overall, Professor Jewitt thoroughly explained everything and made class very enjoyable.

Prof. Jewitt also tends to talk extensively about certain topics that are not as applicable to the quizzes, and this sometimes made it frustrating to try and find the correct answer through the lectures themselves (although this may just be a different issue with the way the course's quizzes are written). However, Dave is the man and a really great professor to have overall.
- Professor Jewitt was extremely engaging during lecture and made the lectures enjoyable so that it was extremely easy for me to understand what he was teaching and to stay paying attention for the entire length of the lecture.
